Tools used by larger institutions:

Hanzo - used by Cocoa Cola and other corporations for their public-facing site

- files are housed on Hanzo's servers (for compatibility reasons) but accessing them is easy (login/password)
- standard file formats of any given capture(s) can be requested
- User can select how many 'links deep' to go on a given site
- Works fairly well for capturing social media sites
 - Some structure is lost but the content is there and very easy to read
 - Does not capture comments

Archive-It - used primarily by Government and University Archives
