IMPACT OF NHPRC IN KANSAS

The National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC) promotes the preservation and use of America's documentary heritage essential to understanding our democracy, history, and culture. Since 1964, the NHPRC has awarded \$207 million to 4,900 projects in all 50 states and special jurisdictions.

Projects of Special Value to the Kansas:

The NHPRC has played a unique role in supporting historical RECORDS projects of special value to Kansas including...

- Important Cultural & Historical Collections support to process the Kansas Sanborn maps, the papers of Senator Robert Dole, the African American collections, and 19th century business records at the University of Kansas; to preserve the Menninger Foundation records, the Kansas Town and Land Company collections, and other collections at the Kansas State Historical Society; and records collections at the Mennonite Library in North Newton and the records of the Leadership Conference of Women Religious in Salinas.
- Local Government Records develop records management and archives projects for Johnson County, Wichita and Sedgwick County through the Wichita Public Library, and others through the Kansas State Historical Records Advisory Board.
- State Archives support for electronic records management for Kansas state government, statewide planning, disaster preparedness, local government archives, circuit rider archivists to provide onsite assistance to small institutions across the state.
