IMPACT OF NHPRC IN MINNESOTA

The National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC) promotes the preservation and use of America's documentary heritage essential to understanding our democracy, history, and culture. Since 1964, the NHPRC has awarded \$207 million to 4,900 projects in all 50 states and special jurisdictions.

Total Cost of Projects supported by NHPRC in Minnesota:

- \$5,078,758 Total Project Funds
- \$2,578,758 Direct Federal Grants
- \$2,500,000 State and Local Contributions

Projects of Special Value to the State of Minnesota:

The NHPRC has played a unique role in supporting historical PUBLICATIONS and RECORDS projects of special value to Minnesota including:

- Establish A Network of Archives in Minnesota support to establish or enhance archives at such institutions as the Minneapolis Institute of the Arts, the Immigration History Center at the University of Minnesota, the American Social Health Association at the University of Minnesota, Gustavus Adolphus College, the Iron Range Research Center, St. Louis County Historical Society, St. Cloud University, and others.
- State Archives Support funding to help enhance the Minnesota Historical Society's ability to preserve holdings, improve public access, and prepare for emergencies.
- Local records in Minnesota support to help organize, preserve, manage, and make accessible local records throughout the state.
- The Papers of John Tanner funding to publish a collection of materials by and about the 19th century explorer's captivity among the Ottawa and Ojibwa Indians.
- Documenting the Minnesota Experience support to document American Indian archives, the electronic records of the state legislature, agricultural and rural life, archives in the Twin Cities, Duluth, Bemidji, and International Falls,
- **Electronic Records** support for preserving historic records held at Minnesota Digital Library, and education programs for XML workshops.
