# **2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Staff Report: Publications Program Overview November–January 2023**

# I. QUARTER HIGHLIGHTS

- Winter Book Sale: SAA's Winter Book sale took place between December 4 and December 22. We sold 136 books and took in \$3,473. Our most sold book during the sale was *Archives in Libraries: What Librarians and Archivists Need to Know* by Jeannette A. Bastian, Megan Sniffin-Marinoff, and Donna Webber. We sold 17 copies of the book, making \$440.
- The Writer's Forum took place on January 9. This opportunity, presented by SAA staff and members of the Editorial Board and Publications Board, taught members how to write for SAA and contribute to its newsletters, blogs, case studies series, reviews portal, magazine, journal, and books! 519 people registered for the webinar and 207 attended. A recording of the webinar will go up on PathLMS. We received a lot of positive feedback on the session:

#### II. AMERICAN ARCHIVIST

#### A. New Issue of American Archivist

<u>Issue 86.2 (Fall/Winter 2023)</u> was published in December and features 7 articles, the A\*CENSUS II Archives Administrators Survey report, a special section on Middle Eastern and North African Archives (7 articles in section), and 7 book reviews.

### B. Special Section on Middle Eastern and North African Archives

Board members Sumayya Ahmed and Rebecca Hankins served as guest editors for the special section on Middle Eastern and North African archives.

#### C. Editorial Board

American Archivist Editor Amy Cooper Cary was reappointed by the Council for another term to serve from January 2024 to December 2026.

The Board met virtually on November 29 to discuss a reviews portal statement on ChatGPT, *American Archivist* 86.2, and a new *American Archivist* submissions workflow. The Board's next meeting is on February 15.

#### D. New Content on Reviews Portal

The Reviews Portal has been active this fall/winter with 3 new reviews on generative AI, presidential libraries, and more. Editors Rose Buchanan and Stephanie Luke continue to publish entries in the Intergenerational Conversations series. In year one of this project, the series focuses on influential articles by archivist and SAA Fellow John Fleckner. Upcoming entries will revisit select SAA presidential addresses. #### III. ARCHIVAL OUTLOOK

#### IV. DICTIONARY OF ARCHIVES TERMINOLOGY

- The <u>Dictionary of Archives Terminology</u> continues to be updated to reflect improvements to
  definitions based on user feedback as well as introduce new terminology. The nine-member
  working group meets every Wednesday via Zoom to define terminology and draft the <u>Word</u>
  of the Week.
- Upcoming this year is a platform migration project for the dictionary's software, initiated by the vendor.

#### V. OUTREACH & PROMOTION

#### A. Archives in Context Podcast

- Episode 1 of season 8 is currently in progress and is slated to be released in January.
- Editorial and Program Specialist Hannah Stryker worked with a former podcast host and a current podcast producer to bring on a new project coordinator, producer, and four cohosts. The new members are invited to attend an initial meeting in January to learn about season timelines and tasks.
- The podcast, which started as a Publications Board and *American Archivist* Editorial Board project, has evolved to be its own group, and has done incredible, ongoing work. It has been formalized as an SAA Working Group, similar to the Dictionary Working Group, to more effectively carry out its mission and include more SAA members in its work. This was approved during SAA's October/November council meeting.
