A summary of activity is below². I am excited to report the launch of a brand new DAS course, in the Transformational Tier. This spring, Richard Marciano and Mark Conrad co-taught a long-awaited course on Enhancing Digital Access, which achieved max enrollment of 35. We began planning for this course in November 2019 and are thrilled to see it come to fruition. I hope to offer it again in the coming season to meet a clear demand.

SAAF Grant for Captioning

SAA Education is the beneficiary of an SAA Foundation Grant of \$3200 to fund the captioning of "legacy" webinar content. Working with Lydia Tang as the primary project manager, we have begun submitting webinar files from the DAS and A&D certificate programs to Rev.com for captioning and transcripts in batches. Volunteers from the Accessibility & Disability section perform QA on the transcripts before they are uploaded to the LMS. The grant allows enough funding to caption all certificate webinar The project team experienced difficulty recruiting volunteers initially, so we made an exception and created an incentive. Volunteers can now access the exams for the courses for which they perform QA, for a reduced cost of \$40.

DAS Certificate / Exam Update

23 registered to date for the May 2022 cycle, compared to 40 in May 2021. Note that people can sign up throughout the month of May, so final numbers should be closer to the 2021 figure.

DEI Next Steps: SAA Foundation Grant

In conjunction with the ARL/SAA/ACRL follow-up event to the National Day of Racial Healing, we made these webcasts available free to members and non-members from March 30 to April 30, 2022. Given our decision to sunset these programs in August 2022, we need to plan for sustainable DEIA programming in the ongoing operational budget.

Total: 726 free access registrations during the promotional month, totaling \$35, 574 in product value. Access to the webinars was 60.7% members and 39.3% non-members.

NHPRC-Funded Management Track

We are completing the final months of this 2-year cooperative agreement, focusing on core skills (technology, finance, and project management) and enhancing the DEIA training options for managers with the remaining funding. We need to plan continuing development in the Management Track as the funding shifts from external grants to operational resources. These are niche courses which I do not expect to meet the registration max. It is important to note that we have not yet been able to execute a marketing plan around this curricular area. With the addition of the Marketing/Communications staff person, we will be able to fully promote these programs to their intended audience and continue to achieve revenue goals. These courses were not budgeted for and were developed with outside funding from SAA Foundation and NHPRC. Going forward, we will need to think about how to support further development in-house.
