Below are the major activities of the Publications Board in the year February 2026–April 2026. This report reflects regular reports made to Council and highlights activity in the publication, as well as other events and initiatives.

Publication

Initial, ongoing and projects nearing completion have the following updates:

- ***Accessibility in Archives*** (Ganz et al) (title TBD) is currently in first draft; draft expected June 2026.
- ***See You at the Meeting*** (Booth/Brown) moved to graphic design. Publication expected Q3 2026
- ***Managing Digital Congressional Collections*** (Dearborn/Bibens/Lay) moved to editorial production (graphics, indexing).
- ***610 Measurable Learning Outcomes for Primary Source Literacy*** (Katz) moved to editorial production (copy edits, graphics). Publication expected in 2026.
- ***Expanding the Record: Case Studies in Reparative Description*** (Wisser/Hinkle) moved to editorial production (graphic design). Publication expected Q3 2026.
- ***Archival Futures series – Infinite Loop: Archives, Time Travel and Pop Culture*** (Thomas/Rawdon) currently available in ALA bookstore.
- ***Archives Fundamentals III series – Selecting and Appraising Archives and Manuscripts*** (Eagle Yun/Weber) finalizing indexing; pre-orders available. Publication expected Q3 2026. Book panel planned for May 4, 2026, featuring co-editors, contributors and Publications Editor.
- ***Radical Visions: New Perspectives on Special Collections Curatorship*** (Cuellar/Czebakow) moved to editorial production (graphic design). Publication expected Q3 2026.

Proposals

Two proposals submitted for the Archival Futures series, one related to Recordkeeping Informatics, and one related to Caregiving in Archives. Recordkeeping Informatics currently in the contract phase. Caregiving proposal still in discussion.

Updates

Incoming Publications Editor, Amanda Greenwood, to start in June 2026, and is currently onboarding and attending meetings related to administration and workflows, active manuscripts, and with component groups.

Publications Program hosted a discussion with the Case Study component groups on Monday, April 13, 2026, to discuss submission and editorial standards, with opportunities to ask questions about larger organization editorial norms and recommendations, promotion (and cross promotion) of various publication formats, and strengthening submission and peer review pools.
