What is a scholar-archivist?

- **Scholar-activist:** “not merely social movement scholars who study movements; rather, they... have a commitment to advance the goals of the movement by sharing their capacities as scholars.” (Bashiri 2023)
- **Scholar-archivist:** Preserves and curates historical records, as well as engages in scholarly research to ensure diverse and inclusive archival collections by sharing their capacities as archivists and scholars.

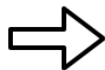
