There was an excellent response to the September call for course hosts, and we currently are working on scheduling approximately 40 workshops from January through July.

Online Learning

The three-part <u>Web Archiving Fundamentals</u> course launched in early July and has had 26 registrants.

Recording of Helen Wong Smith's <u>Cultural Diversity Competency</u> web course, which is provided free to participants, was completed in early August.

In addition, the <u>On-Demand Webcast Catalog</u> now includes 27 webcasts as well as session catalogs of recordings from every SAA annual meeting going back to 2008 – approximately 650 sessions.

All new webcast development is on hold until the director position is filled.

Committee on Education

The Committee on Education completed its revisions of the Archival Continuing Education (ACE) Guidelines, which are under review by the Standards Committee and will be considered by the Council at its November 5-7 meeting. The Committee continues to focus its efforts on collaboration with other SAA entities, particularly Sections, to increase communication and enhance program development.

DAS Subcommittee

The DAS Subcommittee met in Chicago on October 9-10 to discuss a full agenda, including new program development and the status of the DAS comprehensive examination. The subcommittee will recommend to the Committee on Education at its November conference call that the comprehensive exam be moved online only beginning in 2018. This would eliminate an important barrier that some members face in terms of leave time and travel expenses to take the exam.
