Report of Meeting

A group of twelve archivists who work with Congressional papers met informally at the SAA meeting in Washington, D.C., Sept. 1, 1984 to share common concerns and get acquainted.

Cynthia Miller of the House Bicentennial Office described the funcions of her office and the strictly regulated access to House records.

Various archivists commented on access provisions in deeds to Congressional papers.

Constituent correspondence, case files, and sampling in general were discussed inconclusively. With regard to case files a suggestion was made to learn what redundancy exists between Congressional papers and agency files in NARS. (Note: Winn has written to Dr. Warner for suggestions about this matter).

In a discussion of computerized inventory production, Ilana Stern suggested interesting a computer software firm in producing something for Congressional papers.

The group agreed to try a round robin newsletter and to meet at the next annual meeting.
