Cynthia Miller of the House Bicentennial Center was the guest speaker of her office and the strictly regulated nature of the records.

Various archivists commented on access to records.

Constituent correspondence, case files, and other records were discussed inconclusively. With regard to the need for a directory of archivists between the two groups, (Note: Winn has written to Dr. Miller).

In a discussion of computerized inventory production, Linda Vandy suggested interlocking a computer software firm in producing something for Congressional papers.

The group agreed to try a round robin next annual meeting.
