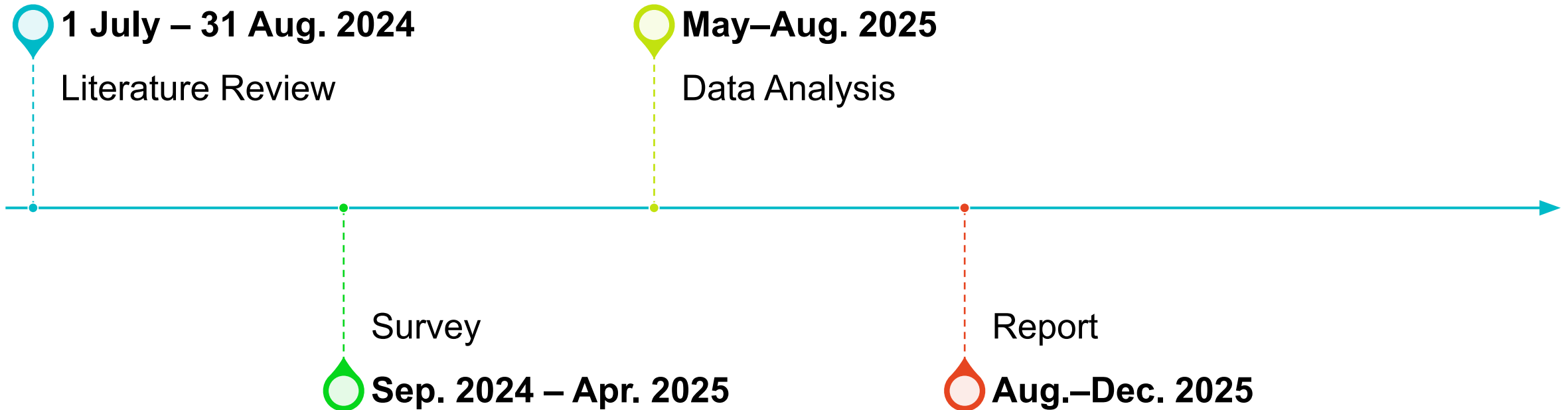

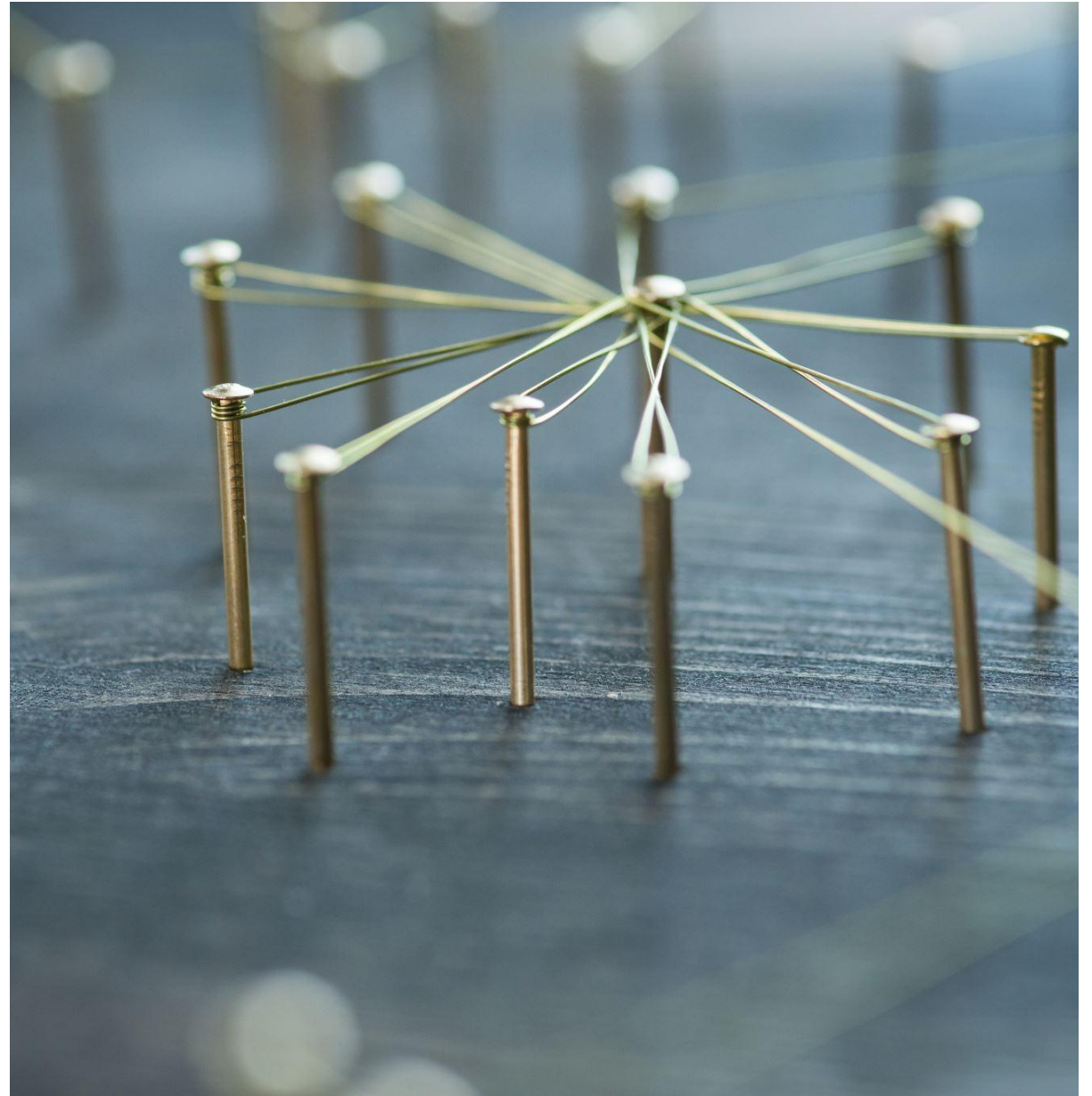

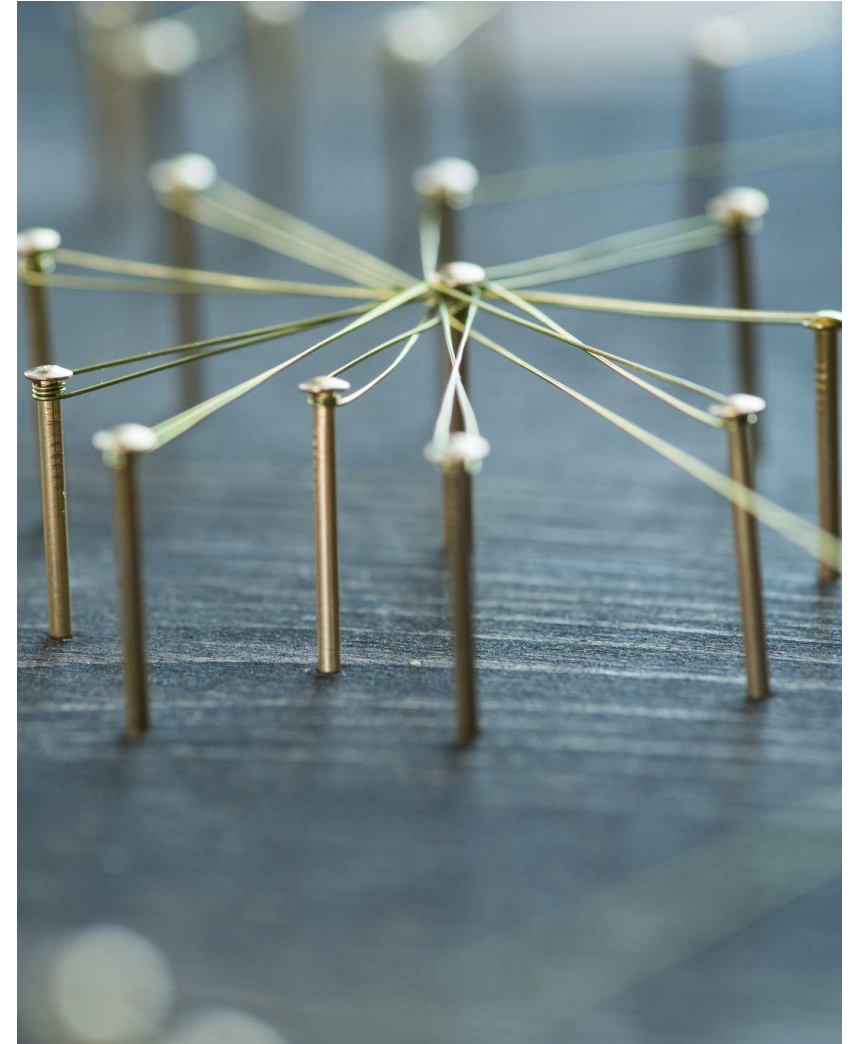

- What are the characteristics of American archival workers who are and are not adopting AI/ML technologies to provide access to digital archival materials?

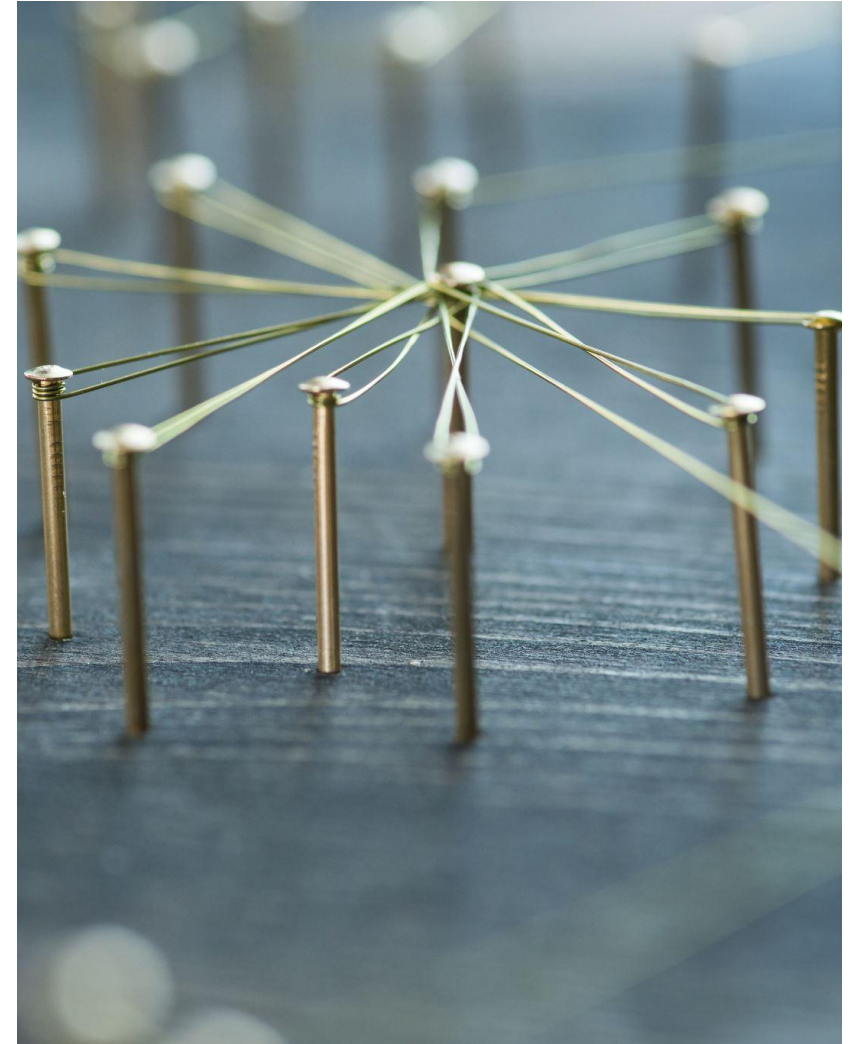

- How are American archival workers currently using AI/ML tools to provide access to digital archival materials?

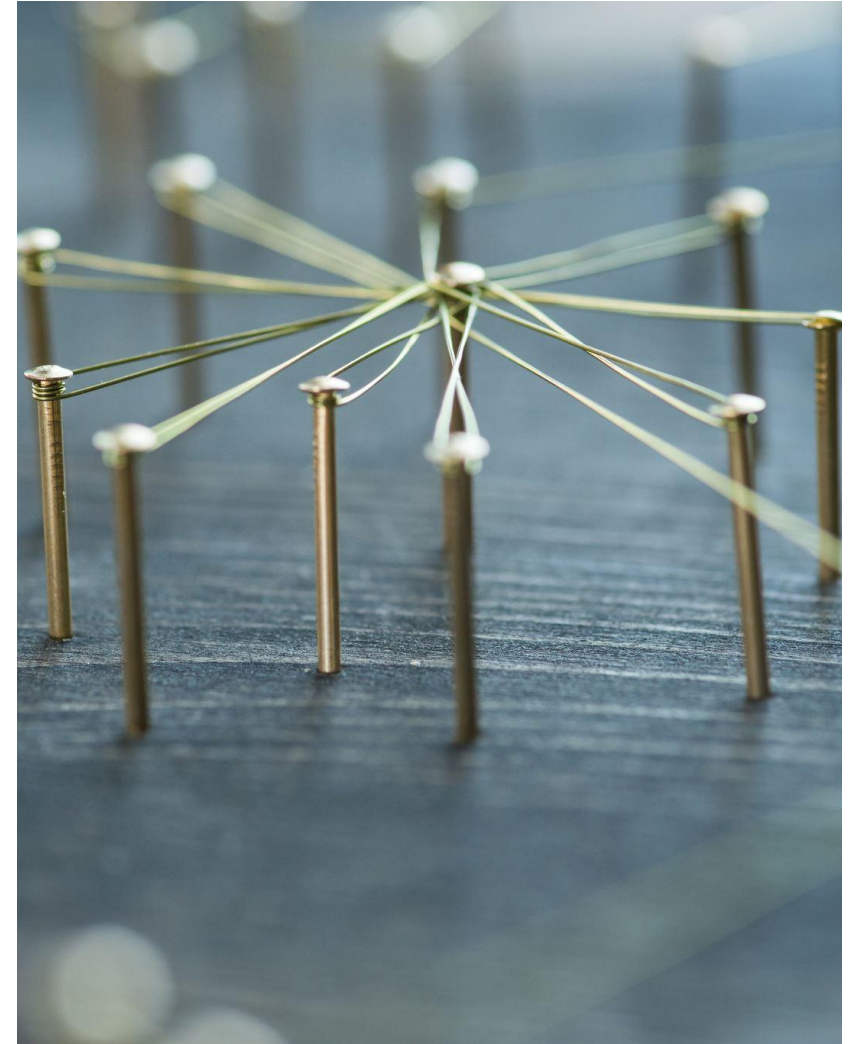

- What are American archival workers' planned use of AI/ML tools to provide access to digital archival materials?

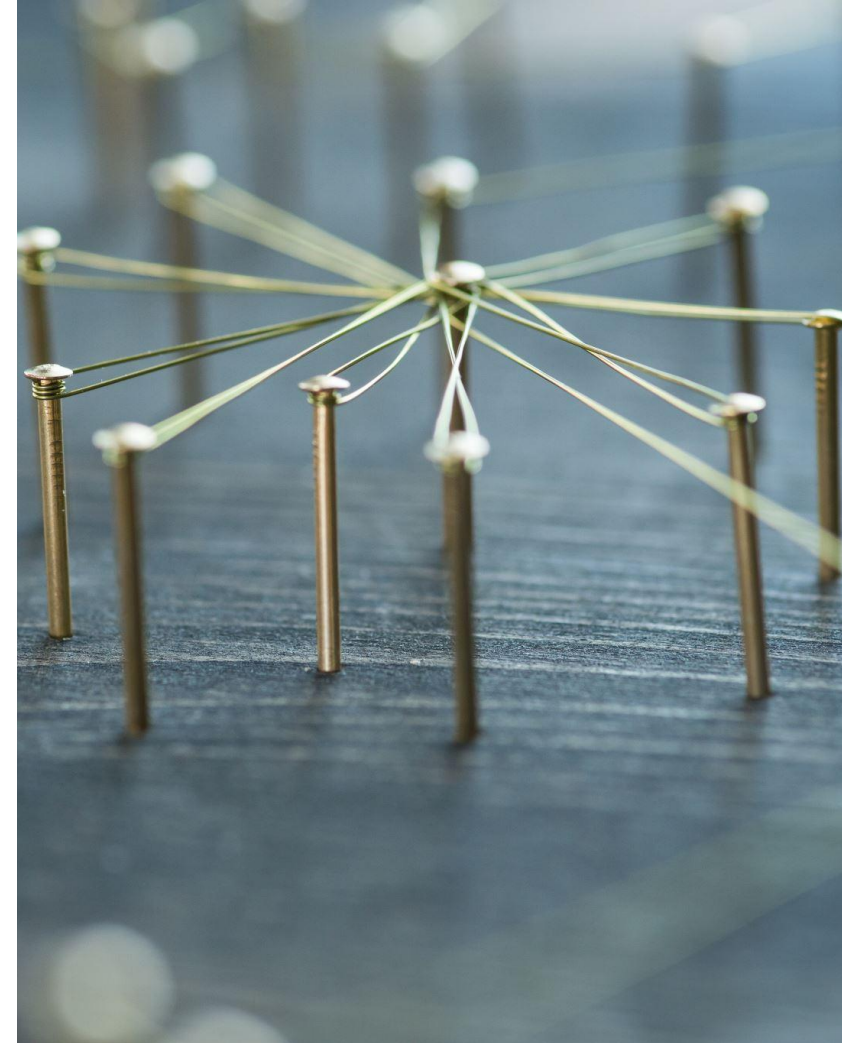

- Why are American archival workers adopting or not adopting AI/ML tools to provide access to digital archival materials?

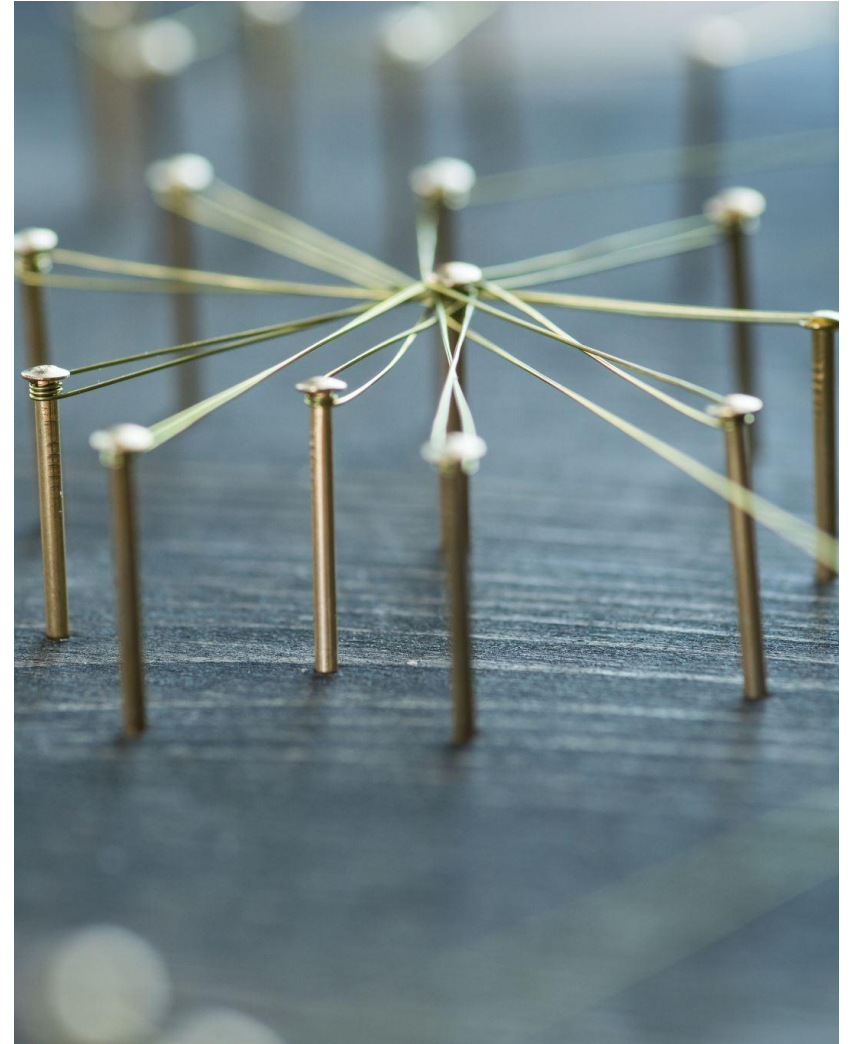

- 698 sources collected identified as related to archives and AI
- Organized in Zotero and Notion
- 66 sources identified as
 - Addressing archival processing and providing access
 - Within a US GLAM framework

Questions for Survey Testers

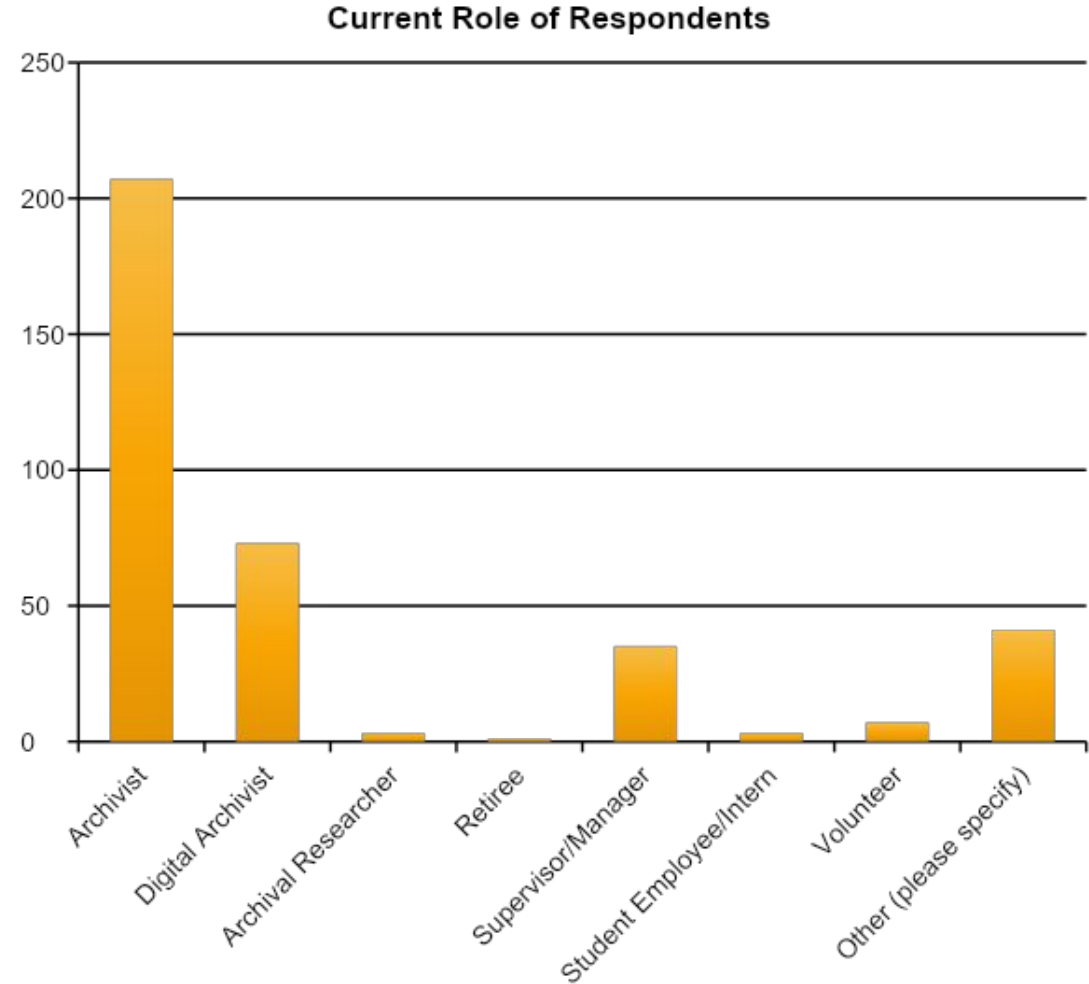
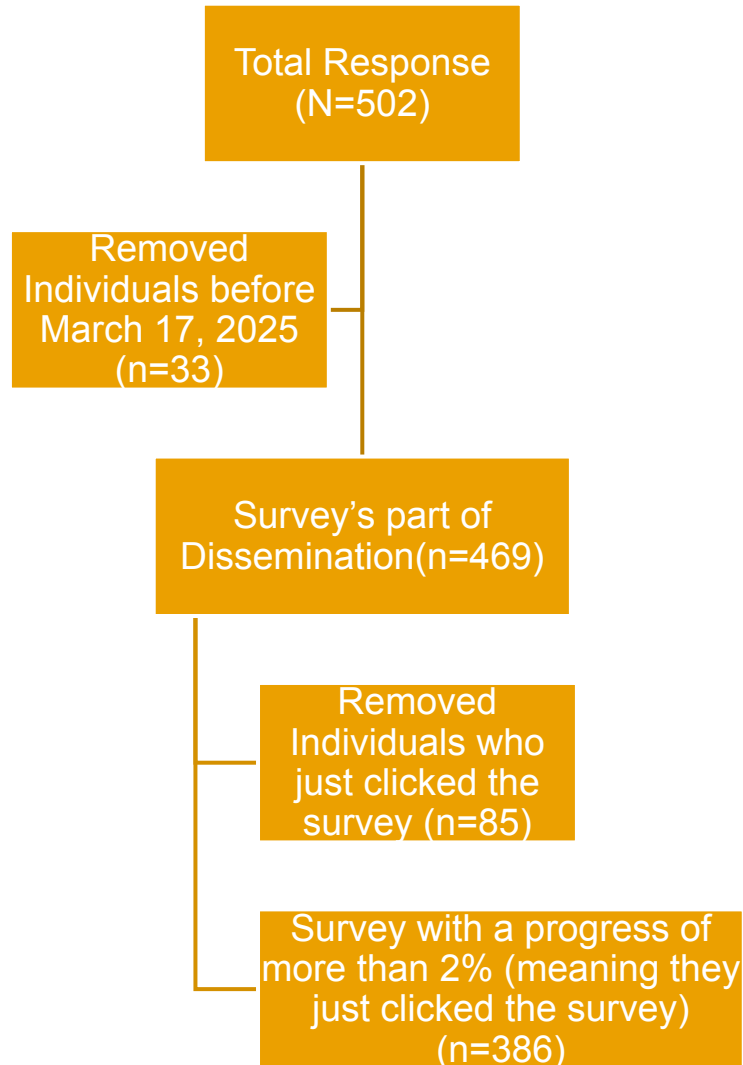
1. How much time did it take for you to complete the survey?

4. Any questions needing tweaking?

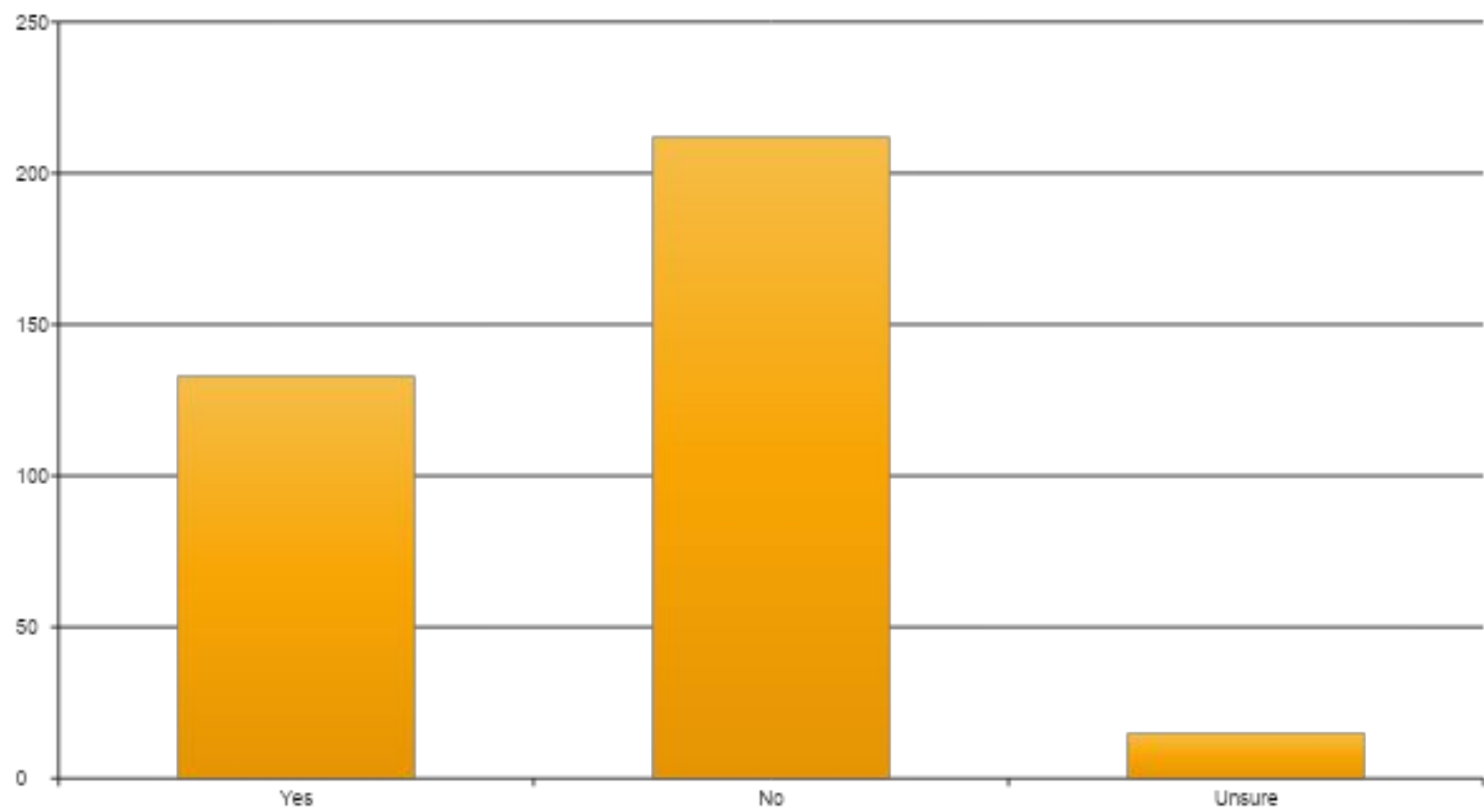
Survey Distribution

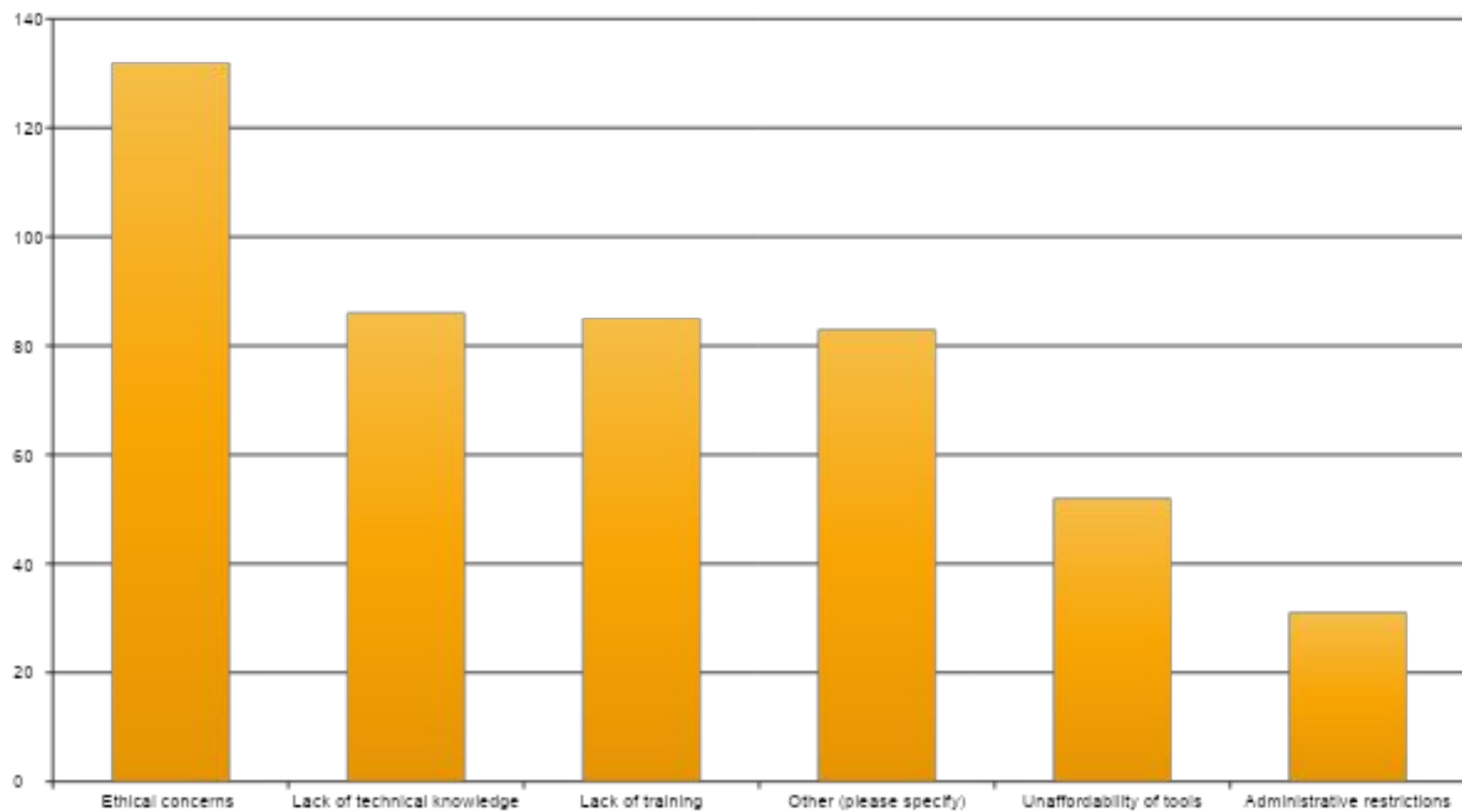
Developed exhaustive

distribution

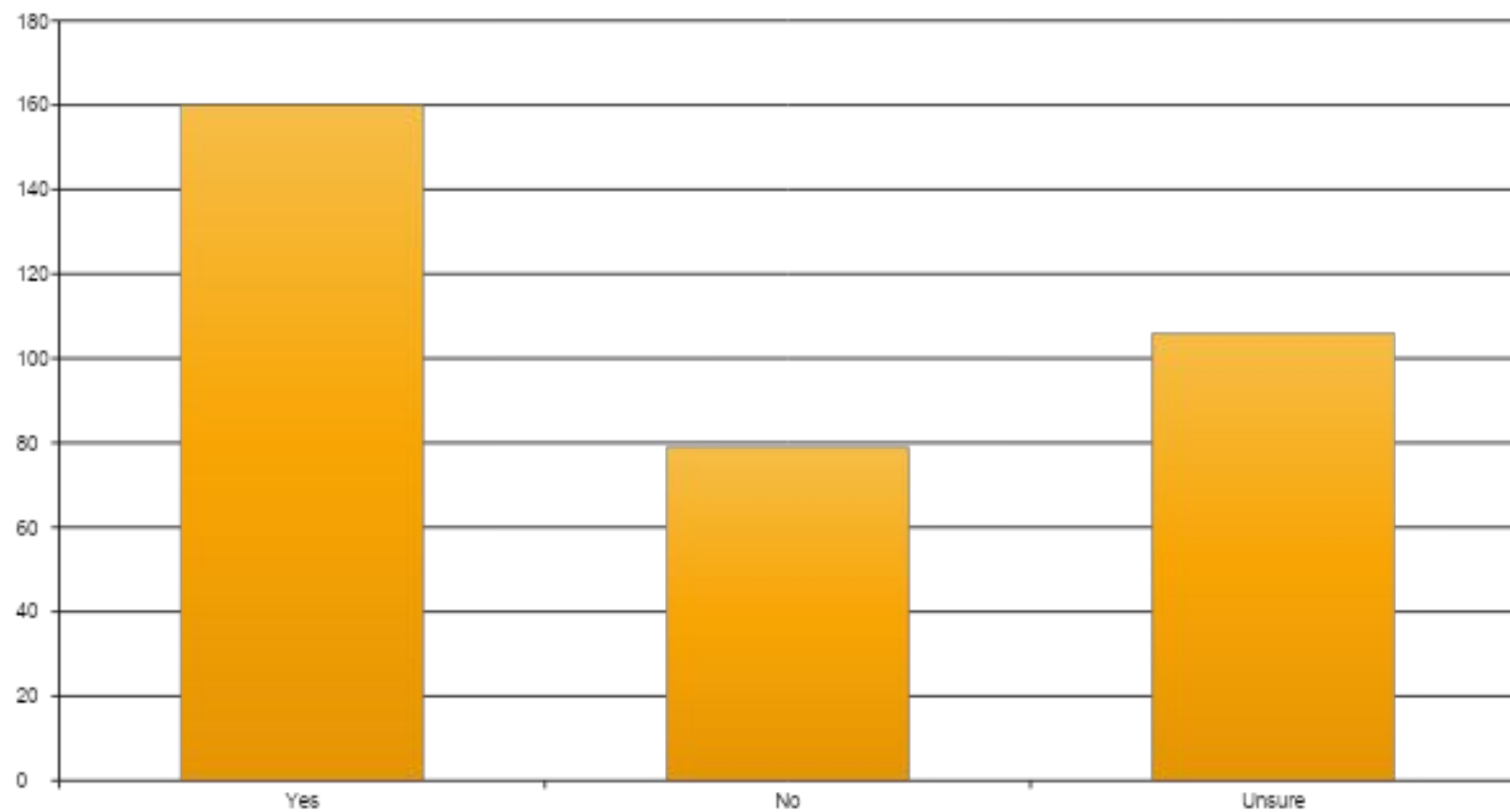

April 8, 2025

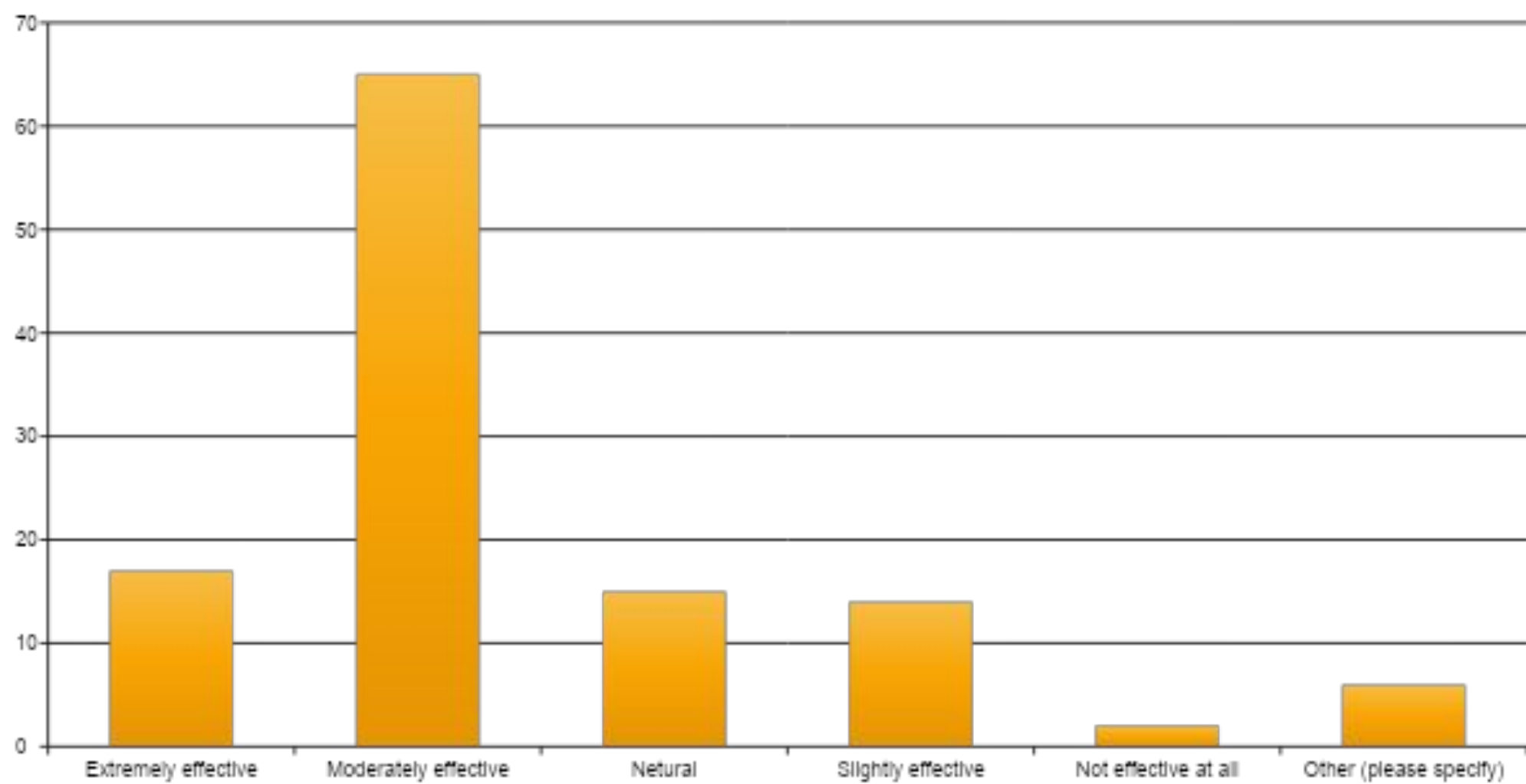

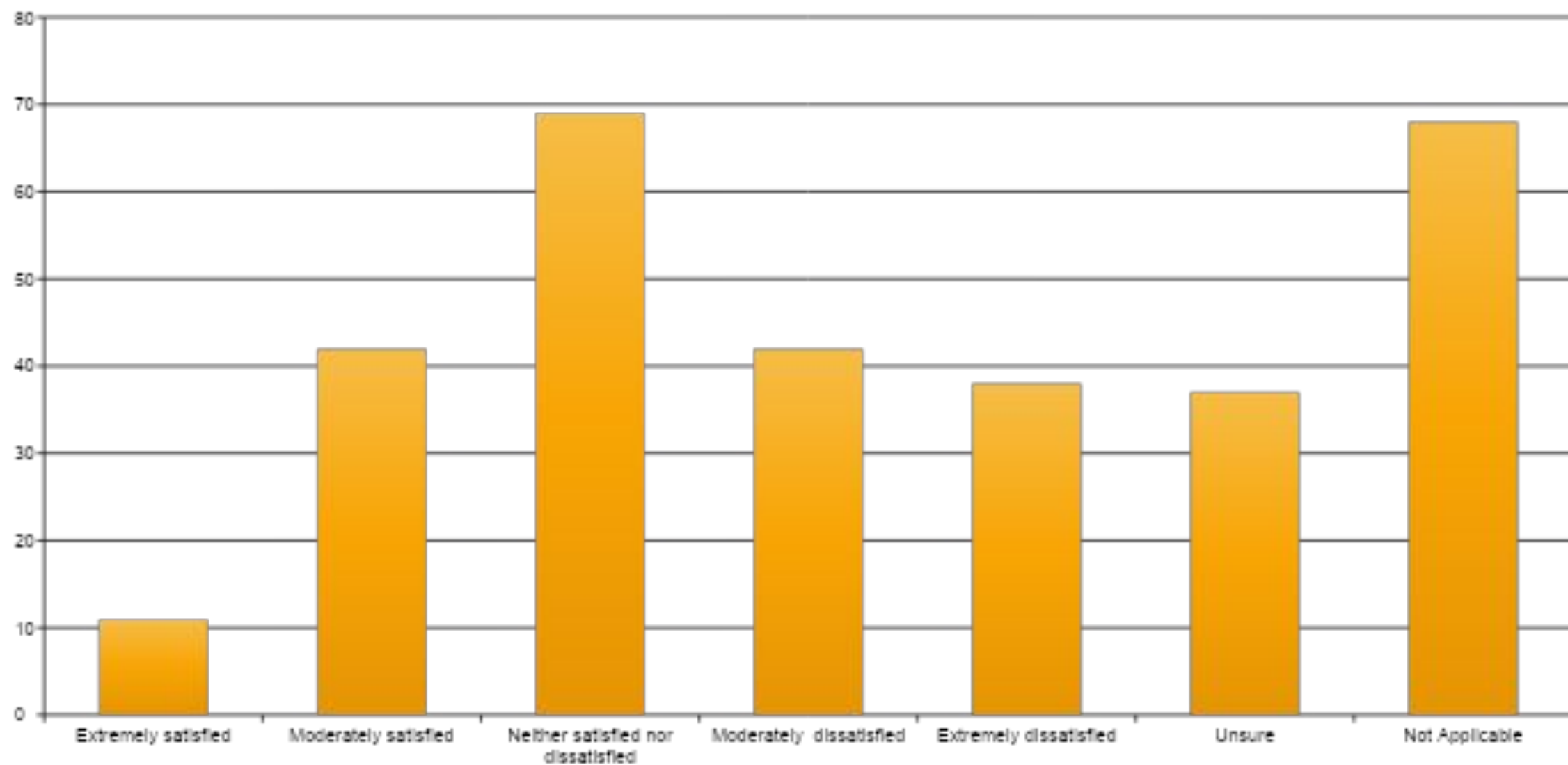


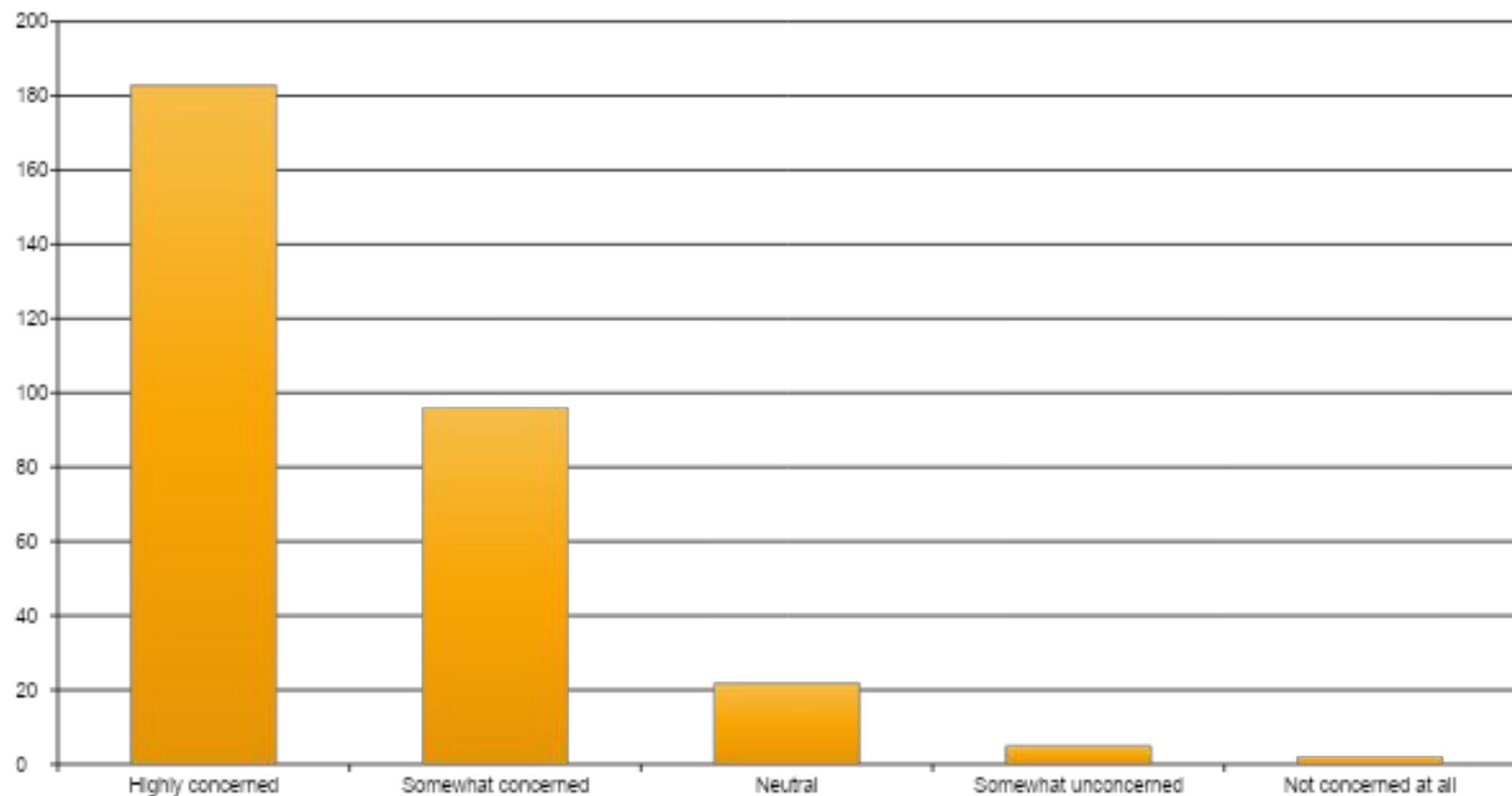
