



Our new Finance Committee is focused on developing our grant-making resources, enhancing the application process, and ensuring that our financial reporting is transparent for donors and friends.


And our new Development Committee is working to support progress toward the common good, introduce new ways of giving, and enhance SAA's culture of giving.
