# Membership

Student membership in SAASC grew slightly this year, when looking at the number of students signed up on Canvas (the SJSU iSchool online learning portal) and newsletter subscribers. In May 2022, SAASC had 294 students on Canvas and over 100 newsletter subscribers. In May 2023, SAASC had 311 students on Canvas and 158 newsletter subscribers. After consolidating the students signed up both on Canvas and subscribed to the newsletter, the total comes to 345 student members.

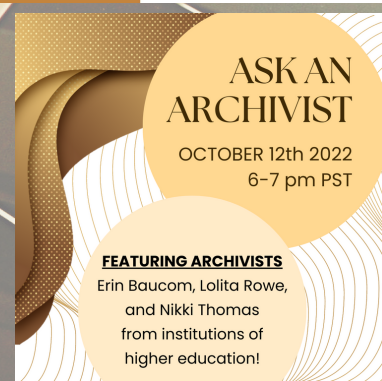
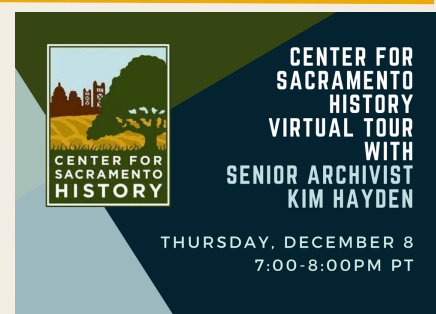
# Events & Activities

Fourteen different virtual events and activities were presented throughout the academic school year. The selection of speakers was influenced by the results of a member survey to find the specific archival interests of the students. Types of archives covered by the speaking events included a local archive, a digital archive, as well as ethnic archives, and how the field of archivy has changed.

Some events were interactive with the members such as an Ask an Archivist Q&A session with a panel of three archivists that was held on Ask an Archivist day, October 12. Students who presented posters at the Society of California Archivists conference also shared their experience of attending the conference and sharing their posters with members with a Q&A as well as other casual hang out sessions that allowed the members to better get acquainted with one another.

The membership director also organized an activity for each semester, a scavenger hunt event in the fall and a personal archive project in the Spring. These activities also enabled the members to get to know one another better and were well received.

Efforts were made to reach out and connect with other students within the SAA membership as well. The membership director reached out to Society of American Archivist Student Chapters from other schools. Some members of the board met with the chair of the SAA student chapter at Rutgers. SJSU SAASC public speaking events were also advertised on the SAA Student and New Archivist Professional discussion board.

## WEBSITE

The SJSU SAASC website continues to function as a useful tool to keep members informed about SAASC activities and archives of interest and the blog. The blog editor created “Archives of the Month”, an additional monthly post to highlight a different archive in addition to blog posts to highlight SAASC activities.

The website was also redesigned to improve user experience by highlighting blog posts and SAASC activities on the home page and adding a menu item for the blog. Other items that were no longer being used were also removed.

## SOCIAL MEDIA PRESENCE

The social media team promoted SAASC activities and blog posts as well as exterior archivist events, internships, and job postings of interest on Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, and Tik Tok. One of the social media coordinators stepped down after the fall semester, so a new social media coordinator was voted in February 2023 and TikTok was added to the social media portfolio. The first TikTok video covering the SAA word of the week was viewed 2900 times. Instagram followers increased by 29% from the fall, with 24% of that growth happening during the Spring semester, when the team added reels, hashtags, and posted 71% more posts.

The SJSU iSchool sponsored ten members of the past and current leadership board to attend the SAA 2022 conference online.
