In late March, SCOSAA hosted a workshop about handwriting transcription presented by member Kayla Cavenaugh, who shared her past work experiences transcribing German-language manuscripts. Attendees learned about AI-powered handwritten text recognition models and participated in person and over Zoom.

August




Our introductory meeting on

August 26 had a good turnout, with 9 attendees. This meeting went over the SAA and SCOSAA, types of events we will do in the future, shared what motivates us professionally and a fun fact about ourselves, and did collage. Two attendees were student SAA members.



September



In September, SCOSAA worked with graduate assistants Shiloh Jines and Lulu Cimarusti and Josh Hockensmith, Art Library Technical Assistant, of the Joseph Curtis Sloane Art Library to host a **tour of the art library**, based on the positive response from February's tour. Shiloh, Lulu, and Josh shared their expertise and we walked throughout the library after closing, learning about Sloane's collection, with special focus on artists' books, the North Carolina Women Artists Archive, and Artists Files. We ended the tour with time to look closely at and handle a selection of zines and artists' books pulled by Shiloh. We had 4 attendees, one of whom was a student SAA member.

October

The main October event was a **From the Page transcription workshop** collaborating with UNC's Wilson Library. Attendees were shown how to use the AI-powered based transcription software From the Page to help transcribe handwritten correspondence for Wilson Library. The goal of this event was to introduce SILS students to these tools and show how they can help contribute to making Wilson's materials more accessible. Wilson is currently piloting From the Page, and asked SCOSAA members to contribute transcription, as well as provide feedback on the platform. This event had 15 attendees, 2 of whom were student SAA members.



Our next October event was a more casual **pumpkin painting gathering** on the front steps of Manning Hall where we offered small pumpkins to paint and decorate along with assorted pins.



November

The penultimate event of the semester was a **talk over Zoom with archivist Jennifer Douglas** (professor, iSchool at the University of British Columbia), which Professor Elliott Kuecker helped host. Dr. Kuecker was very helpful in promoting the talk, after his classes, and even modified his assigned readings to include some of Douglas' literature. Douglas gave a presentation on her work and how people use archiving as a way to process grief and trauma before answering some questions. These included questions submitted ahead of time for the talk and questions written in the Zoom chat. This was the highlight of SCOSAA's Fall semester, with 33 attendees, including the SCOSAA executive board and Professor Kuecker.

A TALK WITH JENNIFER DOUGLAS
