Smaller size for this topic would be a much better approach -- Eventually, I began having my own technical challenges with the downloaded material (in particular, software links) on my own laptop -- unfortunately I opted for not interrupting the class flow -- when I could have used some one-on-one assistance. 4	It wasn't clear why it was necessary (or advisable) to use personal laptops to install and try to use the various software tools when the class was given in a computer lab. Why do I have to expose my personal computer to possible viruses? There also shouldn't be an assumption that every repository has great bandwidth. It took me over an hour to download the zip file for day 2 and we barely used any of those materials in any depth. It also would have been helpful to have had the basic instructions for how to use the various software tools in advance, not just in the workbooks distributed in class. Felt like the part II, rather than building upon concepts or amplifying learning, did not really cover any new ground. 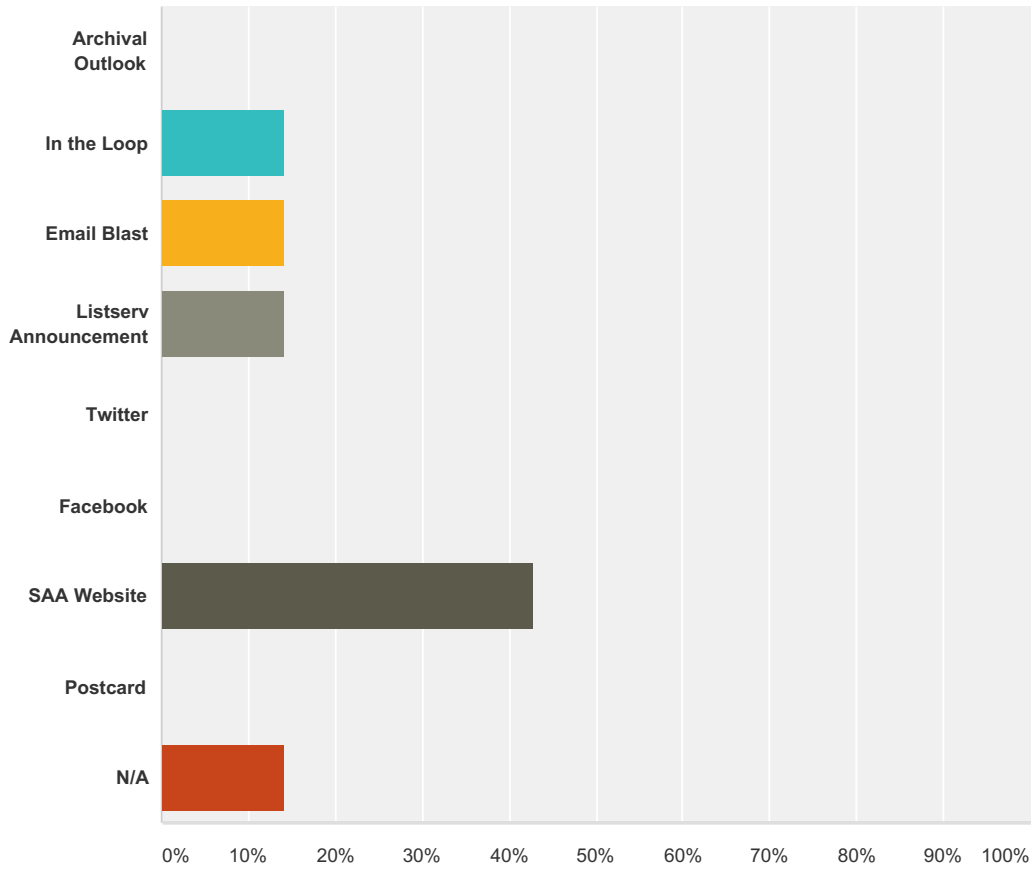

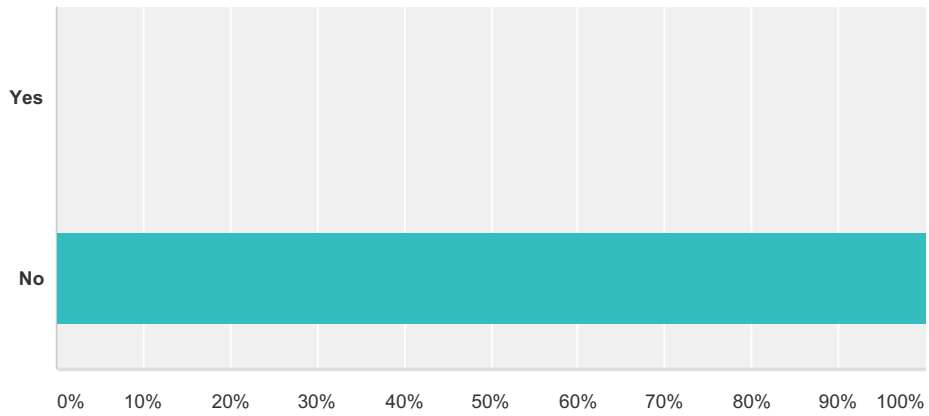
