SAA STRATEGIC PLAN

Goal 1: Advocating for Archives and Archivists

Our section has become more present publicly and has had a bigger presence on our section's Instagram page. By highlighting archival work that is done by archivists, both within and outside of archives, we are bringing attention to the great work we do as a profession.

Goal 2: Enhancing Professional Growth

After the popularity of our Section's presentation at last year's Annual Conference it was clear that there was a need for further professional growth around AMI in archival collections. To meet this need, we have created both training resources and learning opportunities around AMI to help section members grow in their knowledge of and familiarity with caring for AMI collections. We also created a space at this year's annual meeting for section members to meet and network, building connections and opportunities to learn from each other in a specialized field.

Goal 3: Advancing the Field

By creating more training resources for identifying, describing, and preserving AMI material in collections, the section ensures that more archival records will be available and accessible in the future, not just those recorded on paper.

Goal 4: Meeting Members' Needs

Section leadership created training opportunities and arranged presentations around interests and needs that were reported from the section membership survey. The section continues to survey membership and has an open line of communication for suggesting topics and resources.

Summary of meeting activities and highlights:

- The meeting included a council update, guest speaker regarding the CAW in Anaheim, and two presentations by AV experts related to digitization and quality control, followed by robust Q&A related to the presentations. The meeting also included a slide soliciting participation from section members to get involved in the group (present, suggestions for presentations).
- At the annual meeting in Anaheim our section arranged an in-person happy hour at a brewery on Monday, August 25. This had upwards of 25 people cycling in; all were so happy to connect, meet each other and network in person.

SELF-ASSESSMENT

How would you describe the health or energy of the group, and how engaged are the members?

• The section has been working great as a team, dividing up tasks, reaching out to personal networks to engage speakers, and are really committed to bringing the section back to a healthy status.

Did the component group's leadership encounter any challenges in achieving its goals for the year?

We didn't anticipate the interruption, budget cuts, or insecurities in jobs caused by the
current administration. This has caused some interruption in planning while we navigated
people's priorities and availability mid-year. We weren't able to have as many speakers
as we wished this year, but we were able to update all operational files, normalize
onboarding, add social media, and update the microsite.

What suggestions do you have for the SAA Council and staff that might help address these challenges in the coming term?

• It would also be great to bring back section meetings to the annual in-person conference, the virtual presentations lack in-person connectedness, make it hard for people to ask questions in small groups, and most importantly don't allow for networking in any meaningful way. At our happy hour, people were so grateful we were doing something in person, as this is where so many people make connections, ask questions in a small setting, and hold real conversations. In order to inspire people to join sections and have real awareness of group representation at the annual meeting is vital to sustainability, especially since the opening receptions have all but not dissolved.

What questions or concerns do you have for the SAA Council and staff?

 With budget and funding cuts, the membership costs are becoming difficult to retain members in leadership roles. It would be great if membership was included in the conference fee, or if there were financial incentives for participating in leadership (reduced membership).
