

## IMPACT OF NHPRC IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

*The National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC) promotes the preservation and use of America's documentary heritage essential to understanding our democracy, history, and culture. Since 1964, the NHPRC has awarded \$207 million to 4,900 projects in all 50 states and special jurisdictions.*

### **Total Cost of Projects supported by NHPRC in Washington, DC:**

- **\$ 29,338,850 - Total Project Funds**
- **\$ 15,482,850- Direct Federal Grants**
- **\$ 13,856,000 - State and Local Contributions**

### **Projects of Special Value to the District of Columbia:**

*The NHPRC has played a unique role in supporting historical PUBLICATIONS and RECORDS projects of special value to Washington, D.C., including:*

- **Government Archives Support** – funding to begin the archives program within the District of Columbia and to help enhance the Office of Public Records' ability to preserve holdings, improve public access, and prepare for emergencies.
- **Local records in the District of Columbia** – support to help organize, preserve, manage, and make accessible local records at the D.C. Public Library, Friendship House, Howard University, Catholic University of America, American University, George Washington University, Georgetown Visitation, Corcoran Gallery of Art, Gallaudet College.
- **Projects of national significance** – funding to the Carnegie Institution, the Coalition of Networked Information, General Federation of Women's Clubs, International Brotherhood of Teamsters, American Film Institute's National Center for Film and Video Preservation, National Congress of American Indians, American Association for the Advancement of Science, National Business League, American Institute of Architects, and the National Council of Negro Women.
- **Major documentary editions** – project and/or press support for the papers of such historical figures as the First Federal Congress, Eleanor Roosevelt, Daniel Chester French, Charles Willson Peale, J. Franklin Jameson, Frederick Olmstead, the early history of the U.S. Supreme Court, and African-American Historical Linkages with South Africa, ca. 1890-1965
- **Documenting the DC Experience** – support to document DC's history, including the *Washington Star* photograph collection, the Historical Society of Washington, DC, and the Greater Washington Board of Trade.
