In addition, two other modules—**Implementing DACS** (Cory Nimer) and **Becoming a Trusted Digital Repository** (Steven Marks)—are currently being authored. Due out shortly:

- Through the Archival Looking Glass: A Reader on Diversity and Inclusion, edited by Mary Caldera and Kathryn Neal. Slated for print publication February 2014 (and epublication soon after).

The Board reviewed several proposals and continues to shepherd several projects, including:

- A proposal for the second edition of the *AMIA Compendium of Moving Image Cataloging Practice* was accepted and the edition is being edited by Thelma Ross. This publication will be jointly published by AMIA and SAA.
- Archives for Librarians, by Jeannette Bastian, Donna Webber, and Megan Sniffin-Marinoff (manuscript due January 2014).
- SAA Sampler: *Social Justice* (forthcoming Spring 2014).

The Board is investigating the use of web-based software (Open Monograph Press) to coordinate manuscript submission and review processes. We are also investigating licensing options for e-publications.
