Rights and Reproductions

Images of most historical photographs, maps, drawings, etc. in the Anthropology Archives' collections that appear in the online Collections Search Center http://collections.si.edu/search/index.htm may be downloaded and printed for personal or classroom use, without prior written permission, provided that the files are not changed, a copyright notice (where applicable) is included, and the source of the image is identified as either the National Anthropological Archives or the Human Studies Film Archives. All other uses require prior written permission from the Archives. Please submit requests using the Archives' Reproductions and Permissions request form (below).
