

Minutes of the SAA-ACRL/RBMS Joint Task Force on the Development of Standardized
Statistical Measures for Public Services in Archival Repositories and Special Collections
Libraries
August 13, 2014

Following an opening joint meeting of the SAA-ACRL/RBMS Joint Task Force on the Development of Standardized Holdings Counts and Measures for Archival Repositories and Special Collections Libraries (Affiliated Group) and the SAA-ACRL/RBMS Joint Task Force on the Development of Standardized Statistical Measures for Public Services in Archival Repositories and Special Collections Libraries the task forces met separately.

I. Introductions

Members shared their interests and motivations for volunteering. How we collect, what we collect, assessment, and using data for advocacy were recurrent themes.

II. Meetings
