

Description Course/Workshop Scholarships

Building a National Archival Authority Cooperative, a two-year project, offers scholarships for courses/workshops offered by the Society of American Archivists for the new standard, Encoded Archival Context-Corporate Bodies, Persons and Families (EAC-CPF), the revised standard, Encoded Archival Description (EAD), and the updated Describing Archives: A Content Standard (DACS). Limited seats are also available in SAA's DAS courses Arrangement and Description of Electronic Records and Preserving Digital Archives.

These one-day courses/workshops are held regionally from October 2013 – June 2014. Scholarship applications are reviewed by a Scholarship Selection Committee. Applicants will be notified of their acceptance and asked to confirm attendance a month prior to the start of the course/workshop. The goal of this project is to disseminate the standard as widely as possible. **Institutions may submit multiple applications but should be aware, that only one scholarship may be awarded if demand exceeds available scholarships.**

Note that scholarships cover **registration** for the course/workshop and participants are responsible for their own travel and arrangements.
