



- State Archives—Powers and Duties
- Retention and Disposition of State & Local Government Records
- · Funding—Fees and Surcharges

RCW 42.56 (1972): (OPEN) PUBLIC RECORDS ACT –Rights of Public Access / Penalties 21st Century: 2 small towns teeter on bankruptcy due to public disclosure penalties





2016: Washington State Auditor Performance Review

The Effect of Public Records Requests on State and Local Governments

Local Government Public Records Requests (2015): 207,893

Local Government Public Records Request Costs (2015): \$34,000,000

Needed Improvements:

Reduce the potential for litigation and mitigate its impact

Collect and retain only necessary records

Organize records for easy search and retrieval



The Legislature acts (2017)

RCW 40.14.026:

- New Revenue for State Archives & Attorney General
- Local Government Records Management Grants
- Increased Staff for Training and Technical Assistance
- Required Reporting: Motivates Local Leaders

Cities, Towns, Counties, Clean Air Agencies, Fire Districts, Hospital Districts, Irrigation Districts, Park Districts, Ports, School Districts, and Utility Districts

Now what?

JLARC Review 2019:

- 420 agencies who were served reported improved practices
- 76% Approval rating for training, advice and services
- Sunset clause removed from statute

Expectations going forward:

- Long Term Performance Measures
